### LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- 👉 To recognise the challenges in managing relationships with others particularly through times of change.
- 👉 To recognise some ways of dealing with feelings to be effective in these relationships.

Watch episode four of the BBC “The Diary of Anne Frank”.

### INTRODUCTION

The BBC “Diary of Anne Frank” focuses on many relationships between the characters and how these change over time in confinement and as the younger characters grow up.

Pupils should choose one pairing for example:

- Anne and her father, Otto
- Mr and Mrs van Daan
- Anne and Peter
- Anne and Mr Dussel

Ask the class to make some brief notes on what they already know of the relationship.

Watch Episode Four of “The Diary of Anne Frank”.

Take notes on your characters’ relationships.

### MAIN BODY

Create a table to demonstrate the first impression of the characters and how this changes over their duration in confinement and as they grow up.

See attached worksheet.

Early finishers might have time to compare more than two characters.

### EXTENSION

Young people could consider their own changing relationships – How do they relate to their peers?

Friends? Siblings? Family?

Write a short passage about who they turn to for support and advice when they need it.

### PLENARY

As we see from Anne, relationships are difficult to manage, especially when we are growing up. How can we find resolution for fall outs when they occur? What tips do pupils have for conflict resolution?
